EDUCATION FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT PROJECT PHASE II

BACKGROUND

The burgeoning Mongolian economy, fueled by a mining boom, clearly demonstrates the perils of development that ignores ecological facets. Minerals-dependent industrialization has brought with it pollution, water shortages, land degradation, and the harmful exploitation of natural resources. Rapid urbanization has been an offshoot of this economic growth, ushering in several socio-cultural changes, insecurities in everyday life, and materialism. These challenges have prompted Mongolia to shift from a brown economy to green and equitable development, which has made it imperative to align its education system with sustainable development. A multi-stakeholder, synergistic effort by the Government of Mongolia is now mainstreaming Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) in the school system.

EDUCATION FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT CONCEPT

A sustainable development approach requires participation from many different people who have the capacity and opportunities to make informed decisions they find appropriate in different situations, as producers, as consumers, as decision makers, or citizens. The learning takes place during our formal education, in our workplace, and in our everyday life. Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) is a lifelong learning process that helps people develop the knowledge and skills needed to bring about positive changes to build a sustainable future. It requires people to be able to critically analyse current trends, explore conflicting interests, grasp holistic perspectives, participate in democratic processes, and build action competence to individually and collectively develop ways towards a more sustainable future.

PROJECT GOAL:

To promote an environmentally, socially, and economically responsible, equitable, and sustainable future for the people of Mongolia through education for sustainable development.



PROJECT OUTCOME AND EXPECTED OUTPUTS

The necessary competencies are embedded in the Mongolian education system, at the central level, among policymakers, and at the local level, among teachers, practitioners, and local authorities, to ensure the sustainable application of ESD.

- Targeted trainings and on-the-job trainings are organised to strengthen ESD knowledge at the macro, meso and micro levels.
- Quality resources and practical tools for ESD application are available to teachers and other practitioners.
- ESD model schools are identified and supported to further integrate ESD effectively in education and school management, and school-community initiatives.
